
Bloom's Taxonomy

What is It?

Bloom's Taxonomy is the framework that consists of six major categories of thinking: Remembering, Understanding, Applying, Analyzing, Evaluating, and Creating. The taxonomy is used to classify what level of thinking a student is at as well as describing what is required of students in order to develop a higher level of understanding.
